

The First National Study Day on: Developing Academic and Scientific Communication Skills

Academic and Scientific Communication (ASC) is a standard element in higher education policy agendas in most countries around the world. This type of communication sets forth to permit the visibility and accessibility of research in the scholastic societies, hence, promoting scientific research.

It owes its overpowering interest to several interlocked developments including both the digital and market-oriented raging races that universities and research organizations have been subjected to. Thus, the pressure on higher education institutions to secure public approval and worldwide visibility has increased.

As for scholars, researchers, and students across disciplines, there is almost no way to comply with their academic communities, unless they master the Academic Communication Skills (ACSs). ACSs refer to the methods of communication that are formally structured and highly used in scholastic environments. Precisely, ACSs are used to write, to present and to communicate research with other scholars after tailoring the communication to the needs and knowledge level of a particular audience.

To be able to communicate efficiently, novice/expert researchers need to develop ACSs being very crucial for their professional success enabling them to express their own thoughts in their professional fields using various modes of ASC including scientific papers, technical reports, oral presentations, research proposals and so on, in a clear and coherent manner, adhering to all the communication standards of their academic communities.

Building on the mission to improve the quality of higher education programs, equipping PhD students with ACSs has been at the forefront of post graduation programs in many Universities. Yet, not all Algerian post-graduates master or at least recognize their importance. This may be accredited, partially, to the training programs at master and doctorate levels that marginalize raising students' awareness about academic communication skills. Accordingly, placing emphasis on the crucial need of enhancing doctorate students' ACSs, comes this academic event, being the first version of the national study day "Developing Academic and scientific Communication Skills", organized by the Life Skills Research Laboratory at M'sila University.

The event is open to all teachers and doctoral students.

- Abstract to be first sent should not exceed 300 words, and **Must** be written in both English and Arabic.
- Abstracts in Arabic should be written in "Sakkal Majalla" police, and in English should adhere to "Times New Roman".
- Papers should be formatted in APA.
- First page of the paper should include: title, full name, rank, department, faculty, university, phone number (compulsory), e-mail (compulsory) (follow the provided participation form)
- Recommended police size for Arabic papers is 16, and 12 for English.
- Paper pages should range between 8 to 10 pages (compulsory).
